A presentation by David Switzer, PhD
on the great age of sail

This era of American maritime history features the Clipper Ship, America's response to the "search for speed under sail". The story of the rescue of the bow of the "Snow Squall" from the Falkland Islands and its transportation back to Maine illustrates a vivid chapter in American maritime history and nautical archaeology. The speaker is Professor of History Emeritus at Plymouth State University. He is author of a book on privateers and pirates, and many articles on maritime history, and is a Consulting Nautical Archaeologist for the State of New Hampshire.

The presentation will be at the Old Town Hall on route 175 south in Campton, which is handicap accessible. The program is free, and refreshments will be served.
