



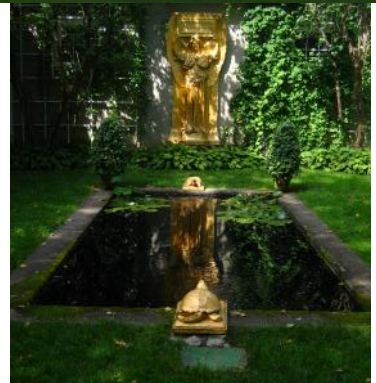

“Saint Gaudens Museum Field Trip”

We will be leaving by bus from Campton Historical Society at 9am for the Saint Gaudens Museum in Cornish NH. It will take about 1.5 hours to get there. Cost of the trip is \$12 which includes the bus and admission to the museum. We will break into groups of 12 for the twenty minute house tour. When you are not in the house tour, you will have the chance to explore the rest of the property’s beautiful grounds and buildings either as part of a guided tour lasting 45-60 minutes or on your own. Augustus Saint-Gaudens (1848-1907), created over 150 works of art, from exquisitely carved cameos to heroic-size public monuments. Works such as the "Standing Lincoln" monument and the Shaw Memorial, continue to inspire people today and his design for the 1907 Twenty Dollar Gold Piece, is considered America's most beautiful coin.
