Directed by a very young Frank Capra, 'The Strong Man' is today hailed as Langdon's best feature, and also one of the greatest comedies of the silent film era. 1 hour 5 minutes

Jeff Rapsis will be taking his place to accompany this feature. There's a reason he will have no sheet music on his keyboard - it's because he'll be making up the music right there on the spot. And it won't be rinky-tink piano accompaniment. Rapsis, a New Hampshire-based musician and composer, will use a digital synthesizer to recreate the texture of the full orchestra, complete with pounding drums and clashing cymbals, all produced in real time by a traditional keyboard with 88 keys.
