## A Soldier's Mother Tells Her Story

Sharon Wood, of Claremont, will portray Betsey Phelps, the mother of a Union soldier from Amherst, NH who died heroically at the Battle of Gettysburg. Mrs. Phelps will tell stories of New Hampshire soldiers who fought in the War, and their families who waited for them to return.

Sharon is a member of the Lincoln Presenters, the League for the Advancement of New England Storytelling, and the Upper Valley Story Circle. For six years, she has organized Story Fest, a festival of storytelling, at the Fiske Library in Claremont, where she works as the Technical Services Librarian.

The presentation will be held at the old Town Hall in Campton, which is handicap accessible, and is on Route 175 south. The program is free, and open to the public. Refreshments will be served.
