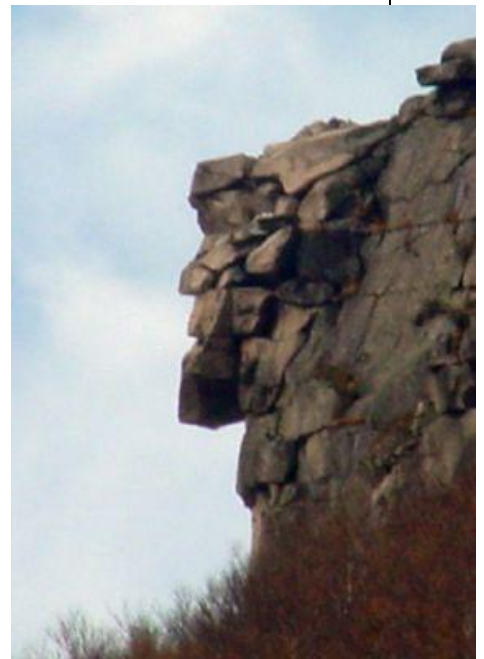

The story of the Old Man of the Mountain is a story of NH itself, reflecting our history, arts, literature, geography, philosophy and even public policy.
