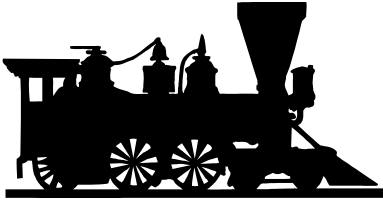

**“Logging Railroads Along
the Pemigewasset River”**

Bill Gove’s latest book

Chug on down to hear the history of the various logging operations that worked the Pemi watershed for a period of nearly 50 years. Among the logging operations covered are the Gordon Pond, Woodstock and Thornton Gore, and Beebe River Railroads, plus the timberland operations of the Johnson Lumber Company, Woodstock Lumber Company, W.D. Veazy and Company, and Parker Young Company. This book reviews the golden age of lumbering and railroading in our area.

Bill Gove is a retired forester from the Vermont Department of Forests and Parks, now residing in Williamstown, Vermont. He is the author of numerous magazine articles, and has authored or co-authored several previously published books, including, *J.E. Henry’s Logging Railroads, Logging Railroads of the Saco River Valley, and Log Drives on the Connecticut River.*
