House Tour - Common Man Inn and Armont Inn

The first "house" is the Common Man Inn in Plymouth. We are meeting at 9:00 at the reception desk. This tour will piggy back off of the talk Alex did at the May program night called The Reuse of Old Buildings. The Common Man Inn was an old wood mill that became a 60,000 square foot Adirondack style inn while retaining 90 percent of original building.
