

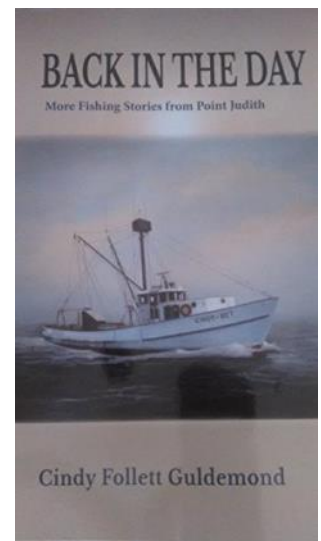
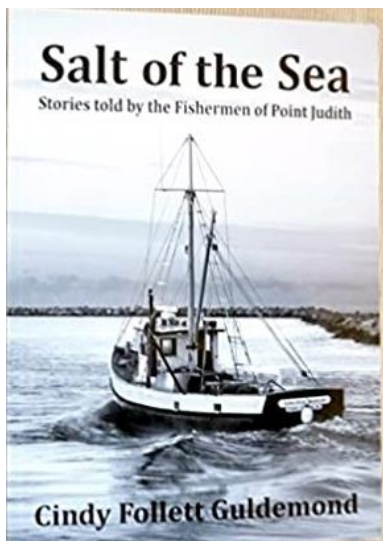

“Commercial Fishing in New England in the 40's, 50's and 60's”

Presented by: Cindy Guldemon

Cindy lives in Campton but grew up as a fisherman's daughter from Point Judith Rhode Island. She has written three books - the first being *Salt of the Sea, Stories told by the Fishermen of Point Judith* in which she interviewed 28 elder fishermen of the community so their stories would be documented. The fishermen tell the stories in their own words. They describe what it was like on and off the shore back in the 40's, 50's and 60's; in the days before fishermen had the technology of radar, lorans, fish finders and telephones. The stories bring to life what it meant to be working far beyond the horizon, with only their skill, courage and a little luck to bring them safely home again. She followed that with *Down the Point - Fishing Stories from Point Judith* in 2015 and *BACK IN THE DAY: More Fishing Stories from Point Judith* in 2017
