"Conservation in Campton"

The Campton Conservation Commission will talk about the basics of land conservation, and how it is in evidence and practiced in Campton. The three town-owned conservation properties and their histories will be featured as examples. The longest serving CC member, Jane Kellogg, will lead the discussion.

Jane has been a member of the Campton Conservation Commission since its inception in 1999. She is retired from teaching elementary school, having taught fourth grade at Holderness Central School. The NH Moose license plate was a classroom brainstorm idea her students started in fourth grade and followed until legislation passed years later. New Hampshire geography and history became of great interest to her when she began teaching those social studies topics after moving to NH from PA in 1987. She has been involved in the town's acquisition of the 3 town-owned conservation properties and will describe their unique histories, natural aspects, and public interest.
